## **Canvas Rebel Final Question**

References: Your work is extensive with a lot of research & detail. Unlike serious writers you use a lot of play on words, humor, irony, all of which are deeply rooted in satire across a wide spectrum of American Pop Culture. Do you have a list of references that tie this interview all together?

Thanks for asking. Most of what I say has been said many times before in great American folklore. I have a lot of fun accessing my favorite American sayings & quotes and putting them together to paint a picture of why the USA is such a great nation & so much fun. I love giving credit where credit is due in a playful adaption of unforgettable American pop culture that shapes all my happiness research. I love giving a shoutout to my favorite literary poets & songwriters whose insightful words echo in my mind and make me smile out loud.

## Play on words

**Grateful Dead** – A cool band with a cool name & playful way to say, I wish "Make America Great Again" would go away. It is funny, being grateful in the USA has been given a death sentence. That is not great. But it is a funny way of saying too many Americans are ungrateful.

**The original sin was using the word "again** "- Original sin is the Christian doctrine that holds that humans, through the fact of birth, inherit a tainted nature with a proclivity to sinful conduct in need of regeneration. Here I refer to the original sin as when the campaign added the silly word "again" making it an UnGreat Full slogan. Sin also rhythms with again.

**UnGreat Full** – The opposite of Great is a word nobody has heard, which is UnGreat. I mean to imply, without being mean, that the slogan says the USA is no longer great & anyone who thinks like that is FULL of it. It is also a great play on words for being ungrateful.

**The Thin Red Line** - When a band of brothers & sister soldiers holds out against a larger force. I use it to illustrate that the thin red line to democracy is fragile & can easily be overrun. There is no way to repair it once the damage is done. It forces us to go to war with pride, where brothers & sisters pick a side, & seek to slaughter their own sons & daughters.

**Yellow-Brick-Road**—I love following the yellow brick road in search of a Wizard who is a GREAT con artist. I also love a good joke more than fact or fiction. I have always made it a point to never let a great joke get in the way of a promising career. Both times this (that would be me) "if I only had a brain" scarecrow graduated college, I strutted across stage like a Snoop Dog and shook hands with two Wizards of ED's (why they were proud of having Erectile Dysfunction I will never know). I imagined both telling me I always had a brain then handing me two Prestigious & Egregious bachelor & master's degrees.

**Road to Perdition** – a state of eternal punishment & damnation into which a sinful and impenitent person passes after death. (*A descent into Hell*) I use it as a play on words for those political fanatics who pick a side, blaming the other side for driving the U.S. to "hell in a handbasket."

**Big Apple** – New York City where all the money flows to the rich & famous. **Mount Guribachi** – in reference to the flag raising by US Marines in the battle of Iwo Jima **Commie-dian** – Play on words for comedian

**Thank you for your service** – a patriotic flair started as a complementary grew into sedimentary pseudowords that military veterans interpret to now mean, "*Piss off.*" This politically correct jargon is rarely followed with words of action like, "*Now how may I be of service to you?*" JSKY – Military veterans ask for nothing in return for their service to their country. It is a privilege to serve.

**Bravado** - an appearance of courage or confidence that someone shows to impress other people. In this "Make America Great Again" basket case I'm making fun of anyone who thinks they alone can make America great again. When your name is Skip Work, you know for a fact that teamwork makes the dream work, so the only way to make the American dream work is with teamwork. This is why I'm asking my teammates to join in a fight and make things right. **Tom, Dick & Karen** – Play on words for the blanket phrase, "every Tom, Dick & Harry." **Karen** - an obnoxious, angry, entitled, and often racist middle-aged white woman who uses her privilege to get her way or police other people's behaviors. It was a ton of fun adding a Karen to Peeping Tom's & the male version of a Karen we all call a Dick. It was a great satirical twist. **Crappy** – Is great when you compare it to hate. It also rhymes with happy & is markedly inferior in quality: not good or pleasant: LOUSY, but better than UnGreat. Plus, it makes "Make America Happy Again" sound super cool & snappy.

**Two wrongs make me write** – If I came out & said I have no doubt and know I am 100% "right," that would be conceited or boisterous (bravado). I use the word "write" instead, to say I am right without saying I was right, even though I know I am 100% right. Alwrite, alwrite, alwrite! "Of Mice & Men" - Novella & movies that preach the dangers of believing in dreams, specifically in the American Dream, while teaching us the value of friendship and companionship. I fit this literary Masterpiece in perfectly with my city mice & country mice play on words that have the potential to CRUSH the entire American dream.

Mr. World-wide – references I want to be just like super successful rap & pop artist "Pitbull" (real name Armando Christian Pérez) and be called, Mr. World-wide... even though Pitbull has a well-deserved patent on that name. I hope he will thank me for my service and not sue me for borrowing it for this interview.

To surely temple American's is to try to break though the flat part of either side of the head between the forehead and the ear, so we can all be kind & happy.

**"If you're happy & you know it clap your hands"** - is a popular traditional repetitive children's song, folksong, and drinking song dating back to 1938 in the Soviet Union. I used it to show *if I am wrong* and everybody in the good ole USA is happy with the divided state we are in, they can give me the clap. I will admit I was wrong, get a shot of penicillin to stop the infection of my misconception and shut down my website tonight, to make things right.

**Human-unkind** – a word I created to show the opposite of Humankind, or better yet the foe of Humankind, are those who are unkind to their own kind.

"I am no longer trom the government, which means I can help." - Play on words referencing Ronald Reagan "Most Terrifying Words - 'I'm from the government and I'm here to help."

**Green Day New Deal** – play on words for AOC's democratic **Green New Deal** which proposals a call for public policy to address climate change along with achieving other social aims like job creation, economic growth and reducing economic inequality. I needed something to tie into the fact I like being an American Idiot. Green Day New Deal gave me the perfect setup pitch.

**Amercian Tdist** - an utterly foolish or stupid person. (There is no such thing as a stupid person... ignorant yes, stupid no. I am an ignorant fool on a grand scale (*nice way of saying I am an idiot*) for thinking I can "Make Humankind Happy Again." When I say I love being an Amercian Idiot my definition of a red-white & blue Amercian Idiot is a dumbass trying to be a smartass. Truth is we historically do foolish things like tell our British Empire King who is ruling the entire world with an iron fist, we do not want to play that King, Knight, Rook game of Thrones & be pawns anymore. Only an American Idiot would do such a thing. That is why being an Amercian Idiot is kind of our thing. Doing idiotic things is what American's are good at.

"Do no harm" - The phrase "first, do no harm" is a well-known part of a Doctors Hippocratic Oath, a pledge that outlines the obligations and proper conduct of all Medical Doctors or pseudo-Doctors who say, (Look at me, I am a PhD General, Weeee!). The Latin translation of this phrase is primum non nocere. The oath emphasizes patients (and patience students) safety is at the center of HEALTHCARE & serves as a reminder for doctors to consider the path of least harm while striving for optimal patient care. A Grief Houdini, I am not kidding, cannot be locked up by grief or human-unkind.

**Vig** - Slang for interest paid on a loan - usually a loan with higher than market interest rates, a loan shark loan. I needed a mobbed-up word to describe what the education system mafia is doing charging high interest on already astronomical student loans.

**Prim & Proper**-means well-mannered, neat, tidy, and formal. It can be used to describe someone who is concerned with etiquette and very conscientious about behaving correctly and

appropriately in social situations. When I think of an ED PhD who thinks they have a chance in hell of teaching me how to be happy... I think prim & proper.

**Oragnet + "just the Lacts ma'am."** - A Dragnet is a system or network for finding or catching someone, like a criminal wanted by the police. **Institute of Yearn, Unlearn, Relearn (I-YURN)** - I LURN is a satirical way to say to pompous higher education, "I learns real good especially without chew." I thought I would add to the crazy mix of doing that thing I do and following the money. The trillion-dollar, management driven education system would have the most to lose if Kennedy abolished the Department of Education after Dallas and replaced it with the Department of Learning. It would have killed a future trillion-dollar management factory. It is just as crazy as any other conspiracy theory so to joke that "the Education System Mob whacked Kennedy," (too soon?) is not so crazy. (yes, it is...but it may not be funny to you, but it is hilarious to me) And yes, I have no proof who killed JFK but I think it might be clear education & management profiteers can never be fully cleared so Dear Zapruder group, this might sound crazy, but here's my number so, call me maybe?

**Polly wanta cracker**- In the mid-1800s, there was a dark cartoon, which depicted a boy who was about to strike a parrot with a stick. The cartoon gives the impression that the kid is upset with the bird and is asking, "Polly, want a cracker?" A cracker in this case is not a snack, but a **whack upside the head**. - **"Insane-in-the-membrane"** American hip hop group Cypress Hill, 1993. It is the perfect pitch for girls & guys like me who are most definitely Amercian Idiot's.
- "Livin' on a prayer" Popular song by Bon Jovi. I used it to show we all (Humankind) are living on a prayer.

- "Liwingon your knees to rise up" From the song, "My Shot" in the Broadway play Hamilton: "Rise up! When you're living on your knees, you rise up, tell your brother that he's gotta rise up, tell your sister that she's gotta rise up, rise up." It is an All-American slogan from an immigrant.
- "All for one and one for all" best known as the motto of the title characters in the book The Three Musketeers, by the nineteenth-century French author Alexandre Dumas. This toast of pride easily applies to all American's who are born to be "all for one and one for all" Musketeers who fight for their rights without any fear... even when we are Mickey Mouse about it & have no idea "Who's the leader of the band that's made for you and me?"
- "The Charge of the Light Brigade" is an 1854 narrative poem by Alfred Lord Tennyson, "theirs is not to make reply, theirs is not to reason why, theirs is but to do and die. Into the valley of Death rode the six hundred." When it comes to Humankind's happiness, it is a do-or-die fight against grief to be happy. The #1 killer of Humankind is not heart disease. The #1 global killer of Humankind is broken-heart disease that makes an actual heart attack look like a blessing in disguise compared to the trials & tribulations of spending a lifetime trying to mend a broken heart.
